#### **About CHF BC**

The Co-operative Housing Federation of BC (CHF BC) is a membership association representing more than 250 housing co-operatives in British Columbia.

CHF BC is incorporated under the *Cooperative Association Act* and is an umbrella organization for a group of related non-profit societies (subsidiaries), including COHO Management Services Society, and Community Land Trust.

Members support their federation through annual membership dues and fees for a wide range of programs and services. CHF BC is proudly independent – none of its annual revenue comes from government. CHF BC's mission is to unite, represent and serve its members in a thriving cooperative housing movement.

## **Project**

The purpose of our education program is to support these members in the achievement of the highest standards of sound management, good governance and principled leadership within healthy co-op communities. As diverse communities, housing co-ops can foster a sense of belonging through engaging in questions around equity, diversity and inclusion and placing themselves on a journey towards Truth and Reconciliation. To support in creating sustainable organizations, members of housing co-ops can develop skills and apply tools respond to the effects of climate change and take meaningful action.

In our commitment to expose our membership to emerging issues and innovative ideas, and pursue ongoing learning, we are reaching out to the wider housing, social and non-profit community sector with an invitation to submit a workshop proposal to be part of our education conferences.

Our bi-annual (spring and fall) education conferences offer spaces for learning with a day of workshops and networking to challenge and inspire attendees who either live in, or provide services to, housing co-ops.

The conference is held in a hybrid format with some workshops fully in-person, hybrid or virtual. The in-person event takes place at the Westin Wall Centre in Richmond, BC.





#### Criteria

## Workshops should:

- Support the sound management, good governance and principled leadership within healthy co-op communities.
- Be relevant to the housing co-op sector
- Offer innovative ideas
- Include strategies to help participants share their learning on their return to their communities
- Be designed for an adult audience and allow for participant interaction and questions
- Run for the entire time block but not run over time
- Be suited for a minimum of ten, and a maximum of thirty participants
- Be suited for in-person, hybrid or virtual delivery

#### Workshops must not:

• Sell products or services

- \$290 (maximum 3 hours)
- Includes lunch
